When Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam was established in 1983, the college came under the jurisdiction of this university. The Al-Ameen Educational Trust has the mission of establishing Centre's of Educational Excellence with modern facilities. The Trust lays stress on the imparting of education with a firm moral base, with the objective that students after completing their education here may develop a strong sense of duty and service to society. The year 1991 was a landmark in the history of the College. It was during this year the College was elevated to the status of a first grade College with the introduction of B.Com Degree Course. This institution has acquired the status of a celebrated first grade college with post - graduate courses and many graduate courses catering to the needs of students to achieve vocational proficiency.
