1. One day Faculty empowerment programme on 'Significance of Building Quality Culture in Higher Education: 14th November 2014

Although quality and quality assurance have become embedded into the discourse of higher education, the development of a quality culture within higher education has lagged behind the implementation of quality assurance practices. IQAC organised a Faculty Development Programme on the topic “Significance of Building Quality Culture in Higher Education) to throw light to the fact that to ensure sustainable high quality education, it is essential to develop an internal quality culture in Higher Education Institutions. Quality is a relative term and its definition varies from stakeholder to stakeholder. The resource person for the programme was Prof. Y. Azeez Ahmed, Special Officer, Al - Ameen Educational Trust, Al – Ameen Campus, Bangalore.

The resource person was able to develop a spark among the teaching community of the institution regarding quality enhancement. Investment in research, adopting student centric teaching aids and instead of following traditional, dogmatic teaching style curriculum should be transformed to a dynamic one.





2. *One day seminar on 'Role of ICT in the uplift of Higher Education' : 12th November 2014*

Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) have become common place entities in all aspects of life. Education is a very socially oriented activity and quality education has traditionally been associated with strong teachers having high degrees of personal contact with learners. The use of ICT in education lends itself to more student-centred learning settings. But with the world moving rapidly into digital media and information, the role of ICT in education is becoming more and more important and this importance will continue to grow and develop in the 21st century. ICTs have the potential to accelerate, enrich, and deepen skills, to motivate and engage students, to help relate school experience to work practices, create economic viability for tomorrow's workers, as well as strengthening teaching and helping schools change. Prof: Vasant Bhatt (Regional College of Education (Under NCERT), Mysore University) was the resource person for the session. He has laid an emphasis on bridging the gap amongst the students, parents and teachers leading to an effective interaction and a transparency between the three. Looking at the present scenario of education, many changes have taken place especially in the teaching-learning to assessment and evaluation. Information and communication technologies are extremely influencing every discipline including Education. It facilitates research and scholarly communication. He finally concluded with the statement -

4. *One day Faculty Orientation Programme on 'Art of Effective Teaching Methods': 13th August 2014*

IQAC organised an orientation programme on Art of Effective Teaching Methods” which was handled by Jb. Subbhan Shereef (Chief Advisor, Al – Ameen Educational Trust, Bangalore). The session started with an interactive session of how to manage the



classroom and to deal with students. The proactive and reactive strategies of classroom management were discussed in detail along with introducing creativity in learning environment. Emphasis was also made in introducing flipped classroom concepts and to maintain effective relationships with students. The resource person highlighted on using brainstorming as a thinking strategy to help students generate questions, ideas and examples and to explore a central idea or topic. This will also in turn help the teachers to determine what students already know or wish to learn, and to provide direction for learning and reflection. It will also stimulate fluent and flexible thinking and can also be used to extend problem solving skills.

The session was very interesting and it really provided new insights among teachers especially newly appointed teachers towards class room management and using effective teaching techniques.
