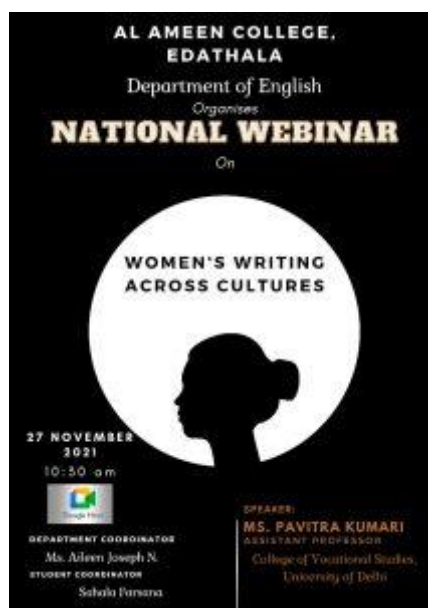




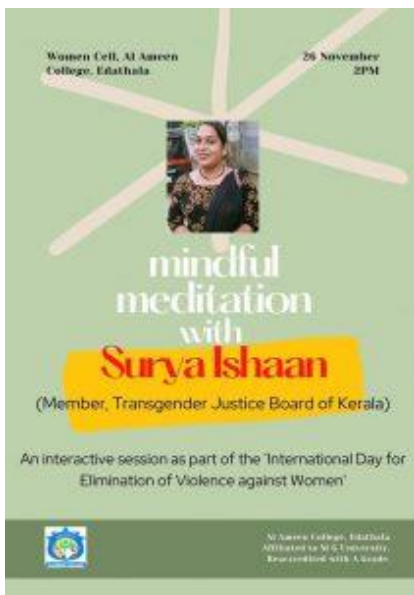
NATIONAL WEBINAR ON WOMEN'S WRITING ACROSS CULTURES ON 27TH NOVEMBER 2021

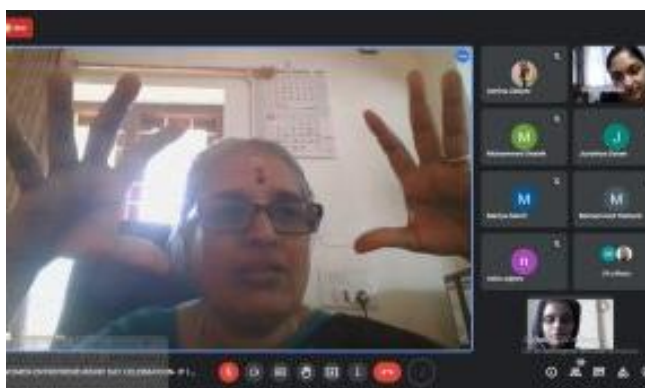

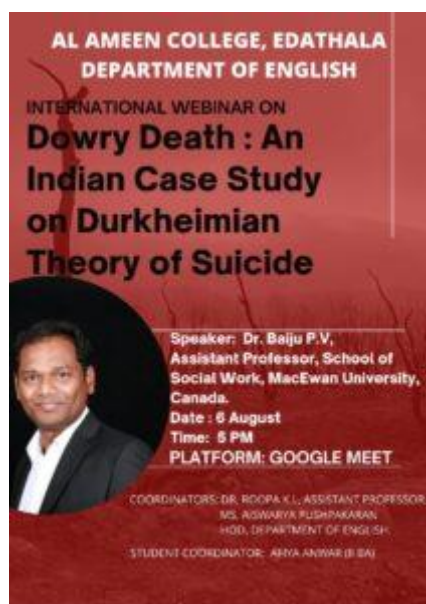
