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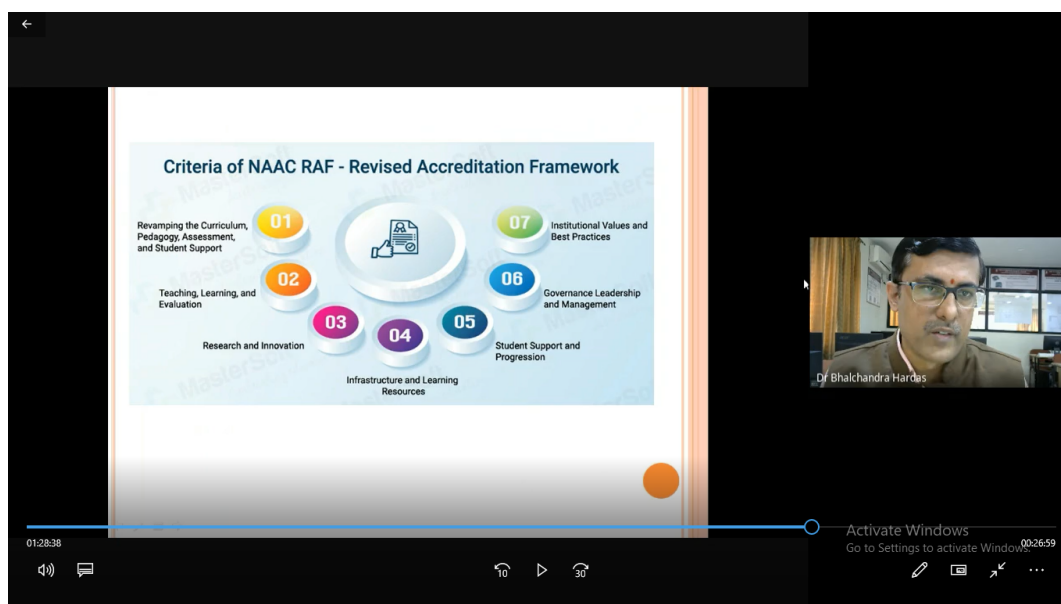

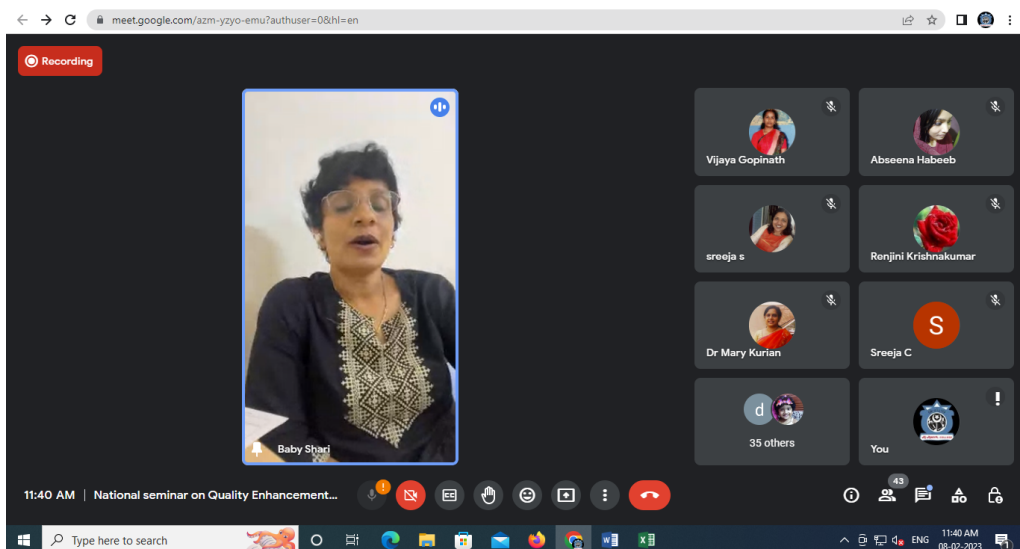

Education Institutions must differentiate between skill based education and knowledge based education. Emphasis should be given to skill development among the students.



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
